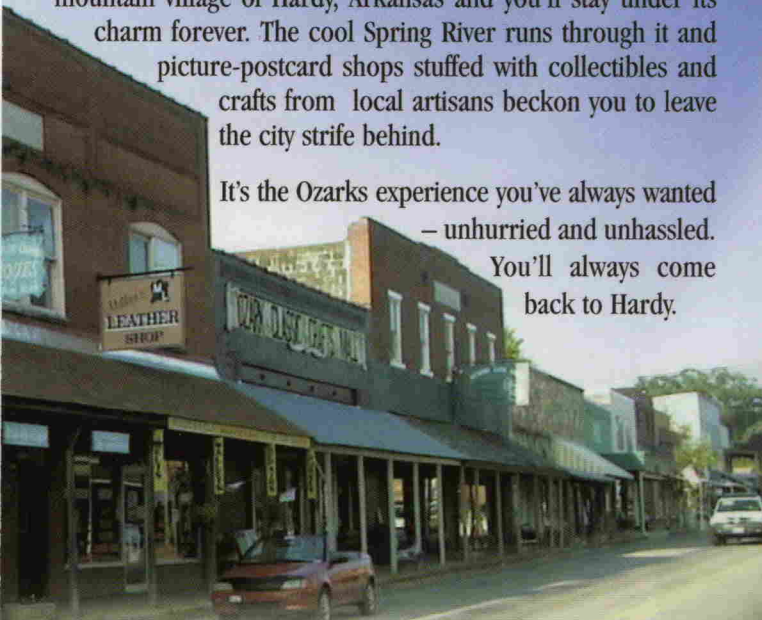


# Welcome to Hardy, Arkansas the Unspoiled Ozarks

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## The Charm of The Ozarks the Beautiful Spring River

Hardy retains its old town flavor by keeping the store front buildings (many on the national historical register) looking very much the way they did in the Model-T days. A Main Street Arkansas City, Hardy is a preserve for quality antique shops, craft stores, specialty shops, gift nooks and restaurants. Motels, bed and breakfast inns, campgrounds, and riverside cabins are available for lodging. Three beautiful city parks are available - one park on Main Street, Buford Park and Loberg Park, overlooking the Spring River and featuring a three-quarter mile walking track.



The Spring River is the tenth largest spring in the world and flows at an average rate of 9.78 million gallons per hour with a constant water temperature of 58 degrees Fahrenheit. One of Arkansas' most popular trout rivers, it is also rated one of the

state's best float streams. In addition to the rainbow trout found in its upper stretches, trophy walleye and bass are found in its lower reaches. Whitewater shoals and rushing falls challenge the canoeist from the River's origins for miles down stream.
